Her trademark exuberance and absurdity play against a backdrop of intimate prose, all centered around a poem of an apple, orange and banana in search of self- understanding. Baroque, disco, funk and opera round out the sound score. Exploding the theatrical moment into shards of colour and texture to reveal the heart of a woman in search of her truest voice – in song, synthetics & silence.

Sara Porter has created over 30 works since 1990, presented in festivals across Canada, the US, and UK. Noted for being truly multi- disciplinary – and her wry sense of humour – Porter's work is rooted in her feminist, queer worldview, and deals with the body as a point of personal reflection, exploring the intersection of memoir and movement. Highlights include "Blossom", a work about erotic poetry that compares women to flowers; "Those Penetrating Dreams", a spoof on Harlequin Romance novels; "Opus Ornithologicus: the great bird work", which she performed for Prince Charles' at the Royal Garden Party in Holyrood Palace, and "Sara does a Solo", her work that explores the difficult terrain of life as a mother and an artist.
